IN ROUMANIA 90.000 action in justice have been open for sabotage in the Economy of the State.200.000 of the persons accused have been condemned to various penalties varying from six months to fifteen years emprisonment, totalling more than I million years emprisonment.

I6 Roumanians who escaped from the country to Bulgaria, presented themselves to the Bulgaro-Jugoslavian frontier. Serbians handed them over to Bulgarians, who handed them to the Rumanian authorities. The wicked process of the Serbians in that case cannot be overlooked.

STRONG RUMORS are spread in Rumania to the effect that the Government will be altered in its composition, that M. Tataresco, formerly the first Minister will be called again to form a new Cabinet. The residence in which he was contrived to live, no longer exists. This political manoeuvre is related to the prospects of the action which will take place before the ONU with regard to the violation of the Peace Treaty by the Roumanian overnment. It is said that the Communists require a clever man, like M. Tatarescu, to defend their cause.

300 COMMUNISTS have been arrested in Rumania to "epurate" the party.

IT SEEMS difficult to collect cereals in Rumania. Peasants resist.

Means of all kinds have been employed to contrive people to obedience. A new system has been imagined consisting in the exchange of cereals against industrial products.

THE PATRIARCH of the Orthodox Church in Bucharest has made a declaration against the Decree rendered by the Pope of Rome, with regards to the Excomunication of Communists. We do not see why the Patriarch should interfere in the Pope's doings. It is obvious that this action serves the Communists.

THE ACTION OF KING CAROL II. The resolution of King Carol II to take an active part in politics has aroused great interest in Rumanian circles, especia-11y among people living in foreign countries. It is the first time that the former King shows his interest in politics, after his departure. He declared that he never abdicated but that he was forced by the Iron Guards to sign an act giving power to his son in the management of the state. The national peasant Party and the Iron Guards have taken position against the King. The former accuses him to have cancelled the political parties in Rumania, However, King Carol II has kept many friends in the Country, where he has left a lot of good work during his reign. He has also sympathies among politicians of great prestige in Foreign Countries. He has struggled against the nazies when they infiltrated themselves in Rumania: it may be that the means he employed to that effect were not quite successful and not thoroughly democratic. However, as his action is against the Communists the best is to wait and see what amount of success he will meet.
